There's no doubt that learning to read and write is a complicated business, made more complicated by the recent rise in standards in national tacting but it's good to know that of

testing, but it's good to know that efforts are being paid off. Over breakfast the other day my eight year old son was quizzed on what a personal pronoun is (that's how we rock in our house!), and he told me - something that, as a secondary school English teacher, I know GCSE students can't always explain. It was also evident at the school where I work, when marking the first writing assessments by our new Year 7s, what secure training they have had at primary school; the writing was far more confident and technically-secure than we have ever seen before and, while this means secondary teachers are having to re-think their approach to Year 7, we're truly grateful as 20% of GCSE English is for spelling, punctuation and grammar, and students are coming to us with a much better grasp of these skills.

So it's clear that alongside all the fun of book week, the book fair, poetry workshops and dressing up, there's a phenomenal amount of hard work that goes into reaching such high standards of literacy, something Newburgh is very proud of as 88% of our Y6 students gained the national expectation or higher in their Writing last summer, 13% above the national average. There is always progress to be made, but as the BFG so beautifully put it: *"I cannot be right all the time. Quite often I am left instead of right."*
