#### Dear parents,

As the weather (hopefully) begins to improve and gets warmer as the Summer Term progresses there are a number of sun-safety issues which I would like to bring to your attention.

We would encourage children to bring a sunhat with them into school each day. This hat <u>must</u> have their name written in clearly please so that children avoid losing or misplacing them. Writing names in children's clothing really helps us if something is lost or misplaced. If there are no names, finding an item of clothing can be very difficult in a school where lots of children have the same items and colours.

Regarding sun-cream. We would ask that parents apply a long-lasting sun-cream to exposed areas before children come to school. Children will be supervised applying more cream should it be required but they would need to do this themselves. An adult will not be able to do this. Local solutions to this issue have been to use a roll-on suncream. If you intend for your children to do this, please could the sun-cream be put into a leak proof bag which is also clearly labelled.

#### ATTENDANCE:

Regular attendance is essential if children are to progress well and develop the habits of successful learners. Please make sure your child arrives promptly for school and only takes time off when absolutely necessary. It should not usually be necessary to be away from school because of a cold and we ask that routine medical appointments, such as dental check-ups, are planned after school or in the school holidays.

In the case of a sickness bug, however, children must be kept away from school for 24 hours after final symptoms to avoid spreading the illness across the school.

Please also note that the majority of children are very honest and will tell us when they have been away from school on holiday even if their parents give another reason! In addition to the impact of missing school, I ask you to consider the long term consequences of a parent asking their child to be less than 100% honest.

## **GOVERNORS' CORNER:**

This year lower school have been using a new method of teaching maths known as Mastery Maths. The teachers have had some excellent training on how to teach mathematical concepts using pictorial, practical and written methods. Each lesson starts with the children solving a problem with their partner. The children understand that being able to explain how they reach an answer is as important as having the correct answer. As they learn new methods and concepts they embed their learning by talking and solving the problem using practical apparatus. For example in Y1 we use Numicon to teach number bonds to 10 and in Y3 we use this as a visual way to add and subtract fractions.
