## Dear parents,

If you make a regular visit to the Infant Playground to drop children off or collect them afterwards, or even if you walk past on the way home, you will have noticed that the PTA, along with a National Lottery grant have had some new play equipment installed.

This equipment has been in situ for a while now and should be in use very soon. However, before children are able to use it we are having a small picket style fence put up around the equipment to demarcate it from the rest of the playground. This will enable us to keep it for the use of the intended year group and not all infant children at once.

The installation of this fence will begin on Monday 16th January and should be complete by Thursday 19th January.

This means that the builders will need access through the usual playground gate for the week and we would ask parents and children, therefore, to use the Pathways and Children's Centre path and entrance to the playground at both the beginning and end of the day.

Happy New Year and Welcome back to the new school term! So far this year the school has received 35 new chrome books funded by the PTA totalling over £8000. These are much faster than previous laptops and give each child their own log in and password with access to all the services the school use to teach, whilst easily monitoring how the children use the internet. This is an expense the school would not have been able to afford without the PTA's funding and will benefit every child in the school.

Secondly the school have now received the new bikes, scooters and helmets for KS1, funded by the PTA totalling £1634. These will give all infant children the chance to practice their cycle skills safely, while developing balance, co-ordination and their fitness.

### **FOREST SCHOOL:**

We are very fortunate at Newburgh to have the facilities to give our pupils the opportunity to take part in Forest School activities. Our special Forest School area is at the back of our field under some beautiful, mature, large trees.
