Were you aware that the third Monday in January is allegedly "the most depressing day of the year"? There is no strict science behind Blue Monday, however there is a published formula stating how factors like the weather, debt, the amount of time elapsed since Christmas, the failure of New Year's Resolutions as well as a general feeling of low motivation all contribute to feelings of sadness and hopelessness. This caused me to think of our school's Resilience Training which gave a positive exercise that could counter these feelings, keeping a Gratitude Diary. Each day you are encouraged to think of three things you are grateful for or that went well for you that day. If this seems a tall order try just one thing to start with. It is a discipline to keep this going but we were told it takes 21 days to reverse the brain and in 42 days you should have more energy, better focus and improved sleep, positivity and enthusiasm.

Therefore we need to work at reversing this, as our ability to pay attention and dwell on what is good in our lives is the gateway to happiness. We wish each other a Happy New Year and it may be a particularly happy one if we give the Gratitude Diary a try and focus on the positive in 2018.

EASTER CREATIONS:

I hope that everyone has received a letter over the last week or so about changes we have made to the opportunities we are giving children at Easter this year. In previous years we have invited children to make Easter bonnets, gardens scenes etc. We will be changing this for Easter 2018 to something which we feel will have more of an impact for the whole school and the school site in particular. Activities which we are inviting children to complete this year are as follows:

<u>Reception</u> children are invited to decorate a wellington boot and plant some flowers in them.

Year 1 children are invited to find some flat stones and paint them brightly to make some garden bugs.

<u>Year 2</u> children are invited to create some simple birdseed ornaments which can be hung from the trees on our school field.

Year 3 & 4 children are invited to decorate a plant pot in whatever way they see fit and to plant some flowers or bulbs in the pots so these can be enjoyed around the school site.

Year 5 & 6 children are invited to create a home for an animal. This may be a birdhouse or hedgehog house which we can then use around the site to encourage wildlife to live there.

There will be no judging of entries this year as we feel that this is something where everyone will be a 'winner' because the school site will look amazing as a result.

We would ask that any creations should be made <u>AT HOME</u> please (they will not be made in school) and brought into school during the final week of this term – the week commencing Monday 26th March 2018. This may seem like a long way off, but hopefully by sending this information out early it will give you chance to prepare some fantastic creations!

WATER BOTTLES:

We still have some children who are not taking the opportunity to keep themselves hydrated via one of our three new water coolers. Children only need to bring a bottle into school so that
