COMMUNITY POLICE NOTICE:

On Saturday 8th October 'Good egg Safety', along with the local police team, are running a Child car seat safety engagement event at Sainsburys, Shires Retail Park. Leamington. We will be there between 11am and 4pm.

This event is aimed at parents and carers of children and we are hoping to educate them around the safety of child car seats and booster seats. We will offer advice and free child seat checks.

Good Egg Safety is all about keeping families safer. As parents, we don't intentionally fit our child's seat incorrectly, however, if we are unaware of the possible errors that can occur then we cannot ensure our little ones are sitting safely. During 2014, we found on average, that 67% of child seats across the UK were fitted incorrectly.



























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Please remember our responsibilities to ourselves and our children when driving or parking around the school site.

This is especially important where children and parents are crossing Kipling Avenue to enter school.

Please note that children should be arriving at school at 8.45am at the earliest please.

Justine Greening was questioned by the House of Commons Education Select Committee on her new role as Secretary of State for Education.
