LEAVE OF ABSENCE DURING TERM TIME (UPDATED INFORMATION FOR PARENTS)

The Supreme Court recently reached a decision in the case of Platt v Isle of Wight Council which has clarified the law on unauthorised leave, including holidays, during term time. The parents of children of compulsory school age are required to ensure that they attend school on a regular basis. The Supreme Court has made clear that attending school 'regularly' means that the children must attend school on every day that they are required to do so. As such, the parents of any child who is absent from school without authorisation for any length of time are likely to be considered as committing an offence under s444 of the Education Act 1996.

Head Teachers retain the ability to authorise leave in accordance with the Education (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulations 2006. When considering such requests for a leave of absence, the school are obliged to act within the law. Head Teachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances relating to the application. If the leave is granted, head teachers are able to determine the number of school days a child can be absent for.

It is for the Head Teacher to decide what is 'exceptional' and it is at their discretion if the circumstances warrant the leave to be granted. The school can only consider Leave of Absence requests which are made by the 'resident' parent.

Each application for a leave of absence will be considered on a case by case basis and on its own merits.

Where applications for leave of absence are made in advance and refused, the child will be required to be in school on the dates set out in the application. If the child is absent during that period, it will be recorded as an unauthorised absence. Failure to make an application for leave in advance will result in the absence being recorded as an unauthorised absence.

Your child's progress academically as well as socially is our shared priority. Please consult the school office if you require a Leave of Absence form to be completed, returned and considered.























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Please remember our responsibilities to ourselves and our children when driving or parking around the school site.

This is especially important where children and parents are crossing Kipling Avenue to enter school.

Please note that children should be arriving at school at 8.45am at the earliest.

GOVERNORS CORNER:

As the school continues to grow and the amount of pupils attending the school increases, the safeguarding of our children in and around the school is of paramount importance. During the day whilst the children are in school, the school take care of our children, however, as parents, we need to be responsible for the safety of our children at drop off and pick up times. In particular, I am thinking of the parking on Kipling Avenue and Tennyson Avenue and the congestion that occurs around the school gates. By parking too close to the school gates in the areas that are marked with white lines, causes a danger and I have a serious concern that this could lead to an accident occurring, particularly when the weather conditions are as poor as they are currently. I would strongly urge the parents that park in these areas to think about the consequences of this and to arrive at school a few minutes earlier to allow you time to park a little further away in a safe place. Many parents lead very busy lives and I appreciate that the school run can be a hectic affair, however what is important than the safety of our children?

EASTER CREATIONS:

I hope that everyone has received a letter over the last week or so about changes we have made to the opportunities we are giving children at Easter this year. In previous years we have invited children to make Easter bonnets, gardens scenes etc. We will be changing this for Easter 2018 to something which we feel will have more of an impact for the whole school and the school site in particular. Activities which we are inviting children to complete this year are as follows:

<u>Reception</u> children are invited to decorate a wellington boot and plant some flowers in them.

<u>Year 1</u> children are invited to find some flat stones and paint them brightly to make some garden bugs.

<u>Year 2</u> children are invited to create some simple birdseed ornaments which can be hung from the trees on our school field.

Year 3 & 4 children are invited to decorate a plant pot in whatever way they see fit and to plant some flowers or bulbs in the pots so these can be enjoyed around the school site.

Year 5 & 6 children are invited to create a home for an animal. This may be a birdhouse or hedgehog house which we can then use around the site to encourage wildlife to live there.

There will be no judging of entries this year as we feel that this is something where everyone will be a 'winner' because the school site will look amazing as a result.

We would ask that any creations should be made <u>AT HOME</u> please (they will not be made in school) and brought into school during the final week of this term – the week commencing Monday 26th March 2018. This may seem like a long way off, but hopefully by sending this information out early it will give you chance to prepare some fantastic creations!
