Dear parents,

This week I am taking time to remind parents that aggression of any kind towards staff in school will not be tolerated under any circumstance. Sadly staff are having to deal with more and more verbal aggression in particular and that has no place in our school community.

Our one school rule is 'consideration' - be this for children towards each other or involving the adults working at Newburgh. We expect visitors to our school to act with the same consideration towards staff. I have been shocked and saddened to see that there have been a number of recorded incidents already this term where there has been aggression in some form towards members of staff in school. This is unacceptable and cannot continue. Having consulted with the Local Authority over this matter, they have advised me to consider refusing to allow individuals onto the school site if this carries on. Obviously this is not a route I wish to go down unless there is no other alternative. Discussion rather than confrontation has to be the best way forward in these cases. Thank you for your help in this.
