GOVERNORS' CORNER

An Ofsted Day in the Life of a Governor

When you put yourself forward to be a school governor, the last thing you're thinking about is an official Ofsted inspection. However, at some point the call will come. It's an interesting position for governors to be in: we're a group of unpaid volunteers full of goodwill and enthusiasm, but that's not proof of good governance; and somehow we're partly responsible for the overall leadership of the school and the judgement it will receive from Ofsted. It's a daunting responsibility. Ron Binnie, our chair of governors, was notified as soon as the Ofsted call came through, the morning before the visit. He spent that day liaising with Mrs Simpkins, collating all of the minutes from previous governor meetings as proof that we provide the leadership team with sufficient challenge, and buying in chocolate to fortify the staff through the following day. He also phoned the rest of the governing body so that we could organise time off work - employers are obliged to provide us with time to fulfil our governing duties - to come in and meet the inspector the next day. The evening was then spent swotting, as if for an exam, only one where you're not sure what the questions might be: How is sports funding spent? What's the provision for PP students? How would you summarise KS2 results and data trends over the last three years? In actual fact, our meeting with the inspector was really rewarding: while there was a range of issues she clearly wanted to discuss, she also gave us a chance to talk about our impressions of the school and to share our passion for Newburgh. I think what came through quite clearly was that what the inspector was told by the staff was echoed by the pupils and then reiterated by the governors. It showed consistency across the school, a shared understanding and is evidence that we know our school. We were then invited to the feedback meeting at the end of the day where the inspector shared her findings with the governing body and members of leadership. It was a privilege to be part of that, not just to see how the whole process works but also to hear some of the lovely things she said about our school. And in our own tiny way, we governors had played our part and not let anyone down.
