Michael Morpurgo called When Hitler Stole Pink Rabbit: "The most life-enhancing book you could ever wish to read."



Suppose you found, to your complete surprise, that your own father was one of those people.

That is what happened to Anna in 1933. She was nine years old when it began. She was too busy to take much notice of political posters, but out of them glared the face of Adolf Hitler, the man who would soon change the whole of Europe – starting with her own small life.

One day, Anna's father went missing. Then she herself and her brother Max were being rushed away with alarming secrecy by their mother - away from everything they knew, their home and schoolmates and well-loved toys – right out of Germany...



EMAIL COMMUNICATION:


