PE CLOTHING

Children at Newburgh have the opportunity to take part in indoor and outdoor PE lessons throughout the year. Please ensure that your child has an indoor and an outdoor PE kit in school at all times.

Indoor PE kit should include black shorts, white tshirt, socks and pumps.

Outdoor PE kit should include jogging bottoms, white t-shirt, jumper/sweatshirt, socks and trainers.

A couple of weeks ago an actor had a question and answer session with the lower school children. The children having been learning about Romeo and Juliet and came prepared with some interesting questions. She was engaging, informative and held the attention of all the children present. I heard that some of the Year 5 children were rather jealous of Year 3 who visited Shakespeare's birth place this week. Learning about Shakespeare and his works show how history and literature can really be brought to life, sparking an interest in children to want to find out more.
