Dear parents,

As we near the final week of the academic year I would like to focus on small, dedicated group of volunteers (namely the school PTA) who do a tremendous amount of work for our school.

The school PTA organise countless events during the school year to help children enjoy their time at Newburgh. Some of these events are designed to try to raise large sums of money. Others are put on purely for enrichment for children and families.

Without the support of the PTA, children in the school would not be able to experience the diverse curriculum or outdoor opportunities that they are provided with. The PTA put all funding they raise back into the school and in ways that may not be automatically evident. It is undoubtedly a challenging role, but very rewarding and allows an insight into how the school manages the opportunities it provides for the children here. GOVERNORS CORNER:

You may recall that one of our key priorities for improvement for 2017-2018 was to introduce the 'Resilience' project work to all children and parents. During our last Governing Body meeting Miss Reid presented a Resilience Report detailing the effect the project has had on Year 5. The children have been able to apply the skills learnt through resilience to have an impact on their learning and progress.

- * Parents have noted a positive change in their child's behaviour towards homework.
- * Confidence has increased.
- * Children are showing high levels of motivation.
- * Not getting the negative language in lessons.
- * Parents comment on positive change in attitude.
- * It has encouraged a 'can do' attitude to work.
- * It has brought the class together having experiences where

teamwork and cooperation are the only way to succeed.

- * Children are better at supporting each other.
- * At Malvern the resilience task which normally takes 25 minutes to complete took our children only 10 minutes. <u>The fastest it has been seen to be done!</u>

The results clearly speak for themselves. Resilience is a life skill we all need to possess and use, so Newburgh will continue to build on the solid foundation laid down over the last year. Rebecca Poole, Co-opted Governor
