#### **GOVERNORS CORNER:**

I had the pleasure of visiting school last Friday to review the progress of Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) priority; to improve the percentage of children who reach the Early Learning Goal (ELG) for writing.

I was inspired to see that formidable efforts are being made toward this priority and there was clear evidence of students making progress and phonics sessions are fully embedded for the Early Years. I was most impressed by the children's work on display boards, which clearly showed the improvement in their writing just in one term.

Only this week Ofsted has launched its latest Annual Report detailing its findings from inspections carried out in England over the past year 2017/18 and in this report it highlights; 'that the substance of education is the curriculum. It makes no sense to think about education without it'.

Even as parents we have lost the focus on what is being taught in schools and have measured schools on their performance data and performance tables.

What is taught matters, especially in early years as this focus on curriculum helps us to recognise the importance of early literacy and language, which helps to build the strong foundation in English.

As the focus of future inspections will change from data to substance, we should also change our focus and support the school in building strong foundations and supporting children to achieve their individual goal.
