
OFFICE REMINDERS

Rebecca - Daphne Du Maurier


"Last night I dreamt I went to Manderley again..."

GOVERNORS' CORNER - Rob Hughes, Parent Governor

It has been an incredibly busy (as always) and short half term at Newburgh. The Year 6 children and teaching staff have worked extremely hard to navigate their way through the minefield of SATs last week and we await the outcome of those tests in the coming weeks. Whatever the results, it is clear that the huge amount of effort that has gone into completing the SATs has been remarkable.

As governors, we hold regular meetings to discuss various aspects of school and ensure that we are holding the senior leadership team to account for the overall performance of many aspects of school life. Sometimes this can be done by looking at figures and statistics, but often this can be done more by detailed discussion about various areas of the school's performance. Resilience has been a big push within school recently – to ensure that our children persevere and try their hardest whatever challenges lie in front of them. When discussing our SATs tests at our governors' meeting last week, it was amazing to hear about all the efforts put in by the children, but the one thing that summed it up to me was to hear about a child who, despite breaking their arm and being hospitalised following an accident during SATs week, still managed to return to school and battle through the pain and complete their tests – if that isn't resilient, I don't know what is! This, unlike SATs, can't be measured with statistics, graphs and pie charts, but as a life skill is invaluable. Half a great half term!
