### **GOVERNORS CORNER:**

It is well-known among teachers that November is traditionally the month where we see the worst behaviour in schools: the honeymoon period at the start of the year is well and truly over; half-term has been and gone and, as nice as it is, isn't really long enough to re-charge batteries properly; and there's still a good long stretch until we break up for Christmas. With all this in mind, it's not surprising that managing a class of around 30 pupils takes more energy, skill and sheer determination than at other times of year. And of course, pupil behaviour is a particularly hot topic in the news at the moment, with increased national discussion as the long term effects of funding cuts are realised. You may have heard the recent indignant review of the use of isolation booths in secondary schools (they are used in the school where I work - particularly in November!); they are branded as potentially degrading and demoralising, but what seemed to be missing from the debate was the context of the increasing range of complex behaviours and needs that teachers are having to manage in the classroom. Despite the cuts Newburgh has made in recent years, we remain lucky: in comparison to other local schools we have a good number of adults working and supporting our children, from our fulltime learning mentor to our newly appointed Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator. It's worth remembering, however, that we all feel the effects of 'Nutty November', pupils, teachers and parents alike, and we need to help each other through it with clear routines, consistency and a little bit more patience than normal.
