Dear parents,

We are getting to the stage in the academic year when our children will experience a number of really important tests. Despite repeated calls from professionals to reduce formal testing for primary school children, children nationally now experience more tests than ever.

At Newburgh we strongly believe that 'continuous daily assessment' is the key to children's success. On a lesson by lesson basis we don't 'test' children, but by careful observation and excellent teaching we make sure we understand how well children have understood new concepts and adjust our teaching accordingly.

However, tests are also very important. They provide us with valuable 'summative' information which allows us to judge how well each child has progressed at varying points of the year. We understand that some children find 'formal tests' worrying, so we are careful to present formal tests in ways which are unthreatening. We wish all of our children the very best over the coming weeks as they undertake these assessments.
