### GOVERNORS CORNER:

On the 6th of October 2018 St Mary Collegiate church Warwick opened a fantastic Poppy display to commemorate 100 years since the end of World War One. There are over 62,000 poppies in the display. We are lucky enough to have Three poppy displays in Warwick this year, St Mary's Church, St. John's Museum and Guys Cliffe Walled Garden.

The Royal Warwickshire Regiment fought in the war which saw many of them lose their lives during battle. There is a fitting tribute to a Royal Warwickshire Fusilier on the display inside the church.

With other local museums providing hundreds of years of history of the regiment our children have a fantastic opportunity to enrich their learning about the war with a very real local connection.

These displays are available across half term should the children wish to visit them.

The Warwickshire Fire and Rescue Service are holding a competition for local children to enter to highlight the dangers associated with bonfire night. There are two categories:

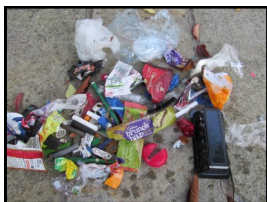
**\* Reception / Year 1 / Year 2: Design a Firework Safety Poster**

### MORNING SNACKS:

Year 1, 2 and Reception pupils are provided with fruit by the school. Year 3,4,5 and 6 pupils may bring in their own fruit or healthy snack (no crisps or sweets please) which is to be packed separately from their packed lunch, as access to packed lunch boxes during morning break is not always possible. To prevent litter on the playground, we ask that snacks with wrappers are eaten in the main hall. Year 3,4,5 and 6 pupils may also purchase toast, fruit and juice from the school tuck shop.
