
BOOK SOME TIME - ILLEGAL



SCHOOL UNIFORM AND DRESS POLICY REMINDER

HAIR - Hair sculpting (eg. Excessive tram lines, ticks and other markings) are not allowed. Hairstyles must be neat and smart. Use of hair gels and/or styling products should be minimal. For reasons of health and safety and to avoid the spread of head lice between children (boys and girls), all shoulder length and longer hair should be tied back with a hair band.
