Career Focussed Education

I recently read an article about career focussed education, which made me think about what is it that we do in our school to prepare our children beyond the curriculum and getting them ready for work

Take a look at any job advert. It is not just about academic curriculum and knowledge, employers are interested in, there will almost always be a list of skills and abilities required such as:

- Communication and Thinking
- Team work
- Resilience
- Leadership
- Creativity
- Organisation and Responsibility

During my visits at the school I have seen examples of all this already happening, for example:

- Teachers encouraging group-working in the classroom by setting children tasks and ensuring they share the workload to reach their end goal.
- Creating opportunities for engaging group working and team activities are also openings that give pupils leadership responsibilities in a supportive and structured environment.
- Encouraging children to complete tasks within a set time, whilst receiving encouragement throughout and praise when tasks are completed.
- Asking children to examine what could have been done to improve as a group and in a constructive, positive manner will also help to improve organisation for next time.
- Offering cross curricular activities to promote character education and instil positive values and boost resilience in pupils.

Building transferable skills can be greatly facilitated by building character and developing strength of character helps to prepare them for the future, whatever they choose to do and wherever they choose to go. By integrating these skills into everyday learning, students start to understand how they translate into real-life situations, and will start to reap the benefits as early as possible.
