

Delving deeper into these points of interest can help embed the things they've been taught and show them you are interested in what they've been learning and that it expands beyond the classroom walls.

If you're looking for a more structured path, the Maths/English open evenings recently announced can shed light on the techniques used for learning at both Key Stages and can provide parents with the tools to support classroom learning at home (...in the car... at bath time...on the toilet!).
