How a Chatter Matters group helps

- Songs and rhymes help children:
 - Listen to and look at people
 - Respond to people with smiles and noises
 - Experience rhythm which will later help their talking
 - Start to understand words
- Play time helps with:
 - Exploring and finding out about their world and will later help them learn new words and how to use them
- Story time helps with:
 - Learning to listen
 - Discovering that books are fun
 - Learning lots of words
 - Finding out about the world
 - Confidence to recall

WHAT HAPPENS AT THE GROUP?



There are usually books or toys to look at while people are arriving. We sit on a blanket on the floor with our shoes off, creating a home-like feel



Groups start with a **Hello song** followed by a choice of old and new songs. The group leader will lead the singing—you can choose when you join in!



STORY TIME

The group leader will share a book with the whole group. Even small babies enjoy hearing the rhythm of a story and learn from being with others who are listening and build their attention span.



ACTIVITY TIME

Treasure baskets to explore and sometimes the chance to make something. We cover a range of activities that are designed to be engaging including:



- Sand
- Water
- Food
- Paint
- Treasure baskets
